# DESIGNING WITH NATURE: WALKING THE TALK FOR SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY DESIGN

#### Goals:

The session will look at the missing link in the promotion of urban sustainability. It will look at the use of a watershed-based approach that manages the natural environment and the built environment as integrated components of the same watershed. The presentation will focus on how to design and build new subdivisions that reduce stormwater runoff volumes and function hydrologically as though still forested. The intent of this new model is to encourage the use of land development practices which lower the costs and maximize the benefits to developers, while providing increased protection to the environment.
